First Responder Chaplain Core Values by Wayne Patterson

In our last newsletter, we explored our shared core value of Compassion. In this edition, we will turn our attention to the shared value of **Prayer**. While listening to Chaplains describe their efforts to provide comfort, a listening ear or helpful resources to those experiencing the worst day of their lives, Chaplains will often comment that their first strategy guiding their efforts is a disciplined impulse to pray before, during and after each call out they respond to.

From our most experienced Chaplains to our Chaplains in training, all realize that every critical incident, tragic accident, or conversation with a First Responder is unique, and presents the opportunity to speak and act in a helpful or unhelpful way.

Responding in the most helpful way could be a word, an action or silence and a calming presence. Regardless, all of these are motivated by a love that is from our God of Love. Chaplains at work are constantly listening and discerning from our Lord what is the next best thing to say or do or not do in this situation? Their ministry of presence is to, in any way possible, help the hurting start to learn how to deal with and even carry the pain they are experiencing. A Chaplain's presence might simply demonstrate to the grieving that they are not alone, but clearly all of it is a sacred work beyond the powers of mere humans and our Chaplains realize this. They realize they are unable to put broken lives back together again, but that our God of love can and does. This why they pray.

This is why we pray for them and all of our First Responders. This is why Jesus prayed...."while it was still night, way before dawn, Jesus got up and went out to a secluded spot and prayed." (Mark 1:35). Jesus chose to spend time alone in prayer because He needed the constant connection with His Heavenly Father, and so do we.
